res	EFORE initial esident / resident nvironment contact	WHEN? WHY?	Clean your hands when entering:  • before touching resident or  • before touching any object or furniture in the resident's environment  To protect the resident/resident environment from harmful germs carried on your hands
<b>2</b> BE	EFORE aseptic procedures	WHEN? WHY?	Clean your hands immediately before any aseptic procedure (e.g., oral dental care, eye drops, catheter insertion and changing a dressing)  To protect the resident against harmful germs, including the resident's own germs, entering his or her body
	FTER body fluid cposure risk	WHEN? WHY?	Clean your hands immediately after an exposure risk to body fluids (and after glove removal)  To protect yourself and the health care environment from harmful resident germs
	FTER resident / resident nvironment contact	WHEN? WHY?	Clean your hands when leaving: • after touching resident or • after touching any object or furniture in the resident's environment  To protect yourself and the health care environment from harmful resident germs
